

HISTORY OF ST. PAUL'S CONT.


Following Whittemore, the Rev. John H. Willis from Stafford, CT, spoke in Thorndike and found there an interested audience. A society was organized in Thorndike; however no records of it exist today. An attempt to form a society in Palmer in 1839 failed. For nearly 20 years there is no account of what happened to the early Universalist pioneers in our area. In the winter of 1857-58, the pastor of the Palmer congregational Church spearheaded a revival. Although the revival generated a great deal of enthusiasm, many people were critical of the minister's dogmatic "un-Christian spirit" and harsh preaching. It was this group of unsatisfied people who invited the Rev. H. R. Nye, a Universalist, to hold services in the Antique Hotel the following summer. The response was overwhelming, so unlike the days of the 1830's! It must have warmed the hearts of the old-time Universalists. Arrangements were made for more services. Included in the list of preachers were "Father" Whittemore and John H. Willis, the pioneers; plus J.G. Adams, H. Fay, G.J. Sanger, C.A. Bradley, Lucius Holmes, J.H. Marvin, J.W. Wilson and Thomas Borden.

This time a Universalist Society was formed. The Rev. N. R. Wright was called to minister to the congregation. In February 1860, they drew up a constitution. The name of the group was 'The First Universalist Society in Palmer'. Its objectives were to "promote truth and morality among its members and also in the world at large," and as "the Gospel of the Lord, Jesus Christ is calculated above all truth" the society pledged to "support the preaching of the Gospel, and aid in any other practicable way in spreading the knowledge of it among men". The Profession of Faith adopted was that of the Universalist Convention at Winchester, NH, in 1803. Signers of the constitution included C.C. Shaw, Marshall Fox, John A. Squires, S.R. Lawrence, George Robinson, J.W. Robinson and Mary A. Shaw.

BARN RENOVATION




